Approval of Minutes and Meeting Agenda:

 - School is in full operation in each class with a total of 291 students this year
 - 11 support staff for special need students;
 - New staffs:
 - o Ms. Joyce Shih who will be job sharing with Ms. Lee;
 - o Ms. Meagan Braun, new Resource Teacher;
 - o Ms. Miriam Ibrahim, student support staff (currently on leave);
 - Ms. Brenda McElroy, our new youth and family worker, who will be focusing on students' social emotional learning and self-regulation skills, and will set activities for students, like friendship group.
 - Our school counselor will be stationed at Laurier every Monday and Tuesday afternoon
 - Our goal "S.O.A.R." already reached its 3-year school plan in June 2018. On Sept 21 (Pro-D Day), staff training will be conducted to discuss the new goal "Critical and Creative Thinking" for the next three years.

- Sept 20, 2018 (Thur): Pot luck dinner starts from 5pm-6pm; then parents to meet their teacher from 6pm to 7pm.
