# **Principal's Report by Janet Souther:**

## **School News - April Highlights**

### **School Plan**

Parents will begin to see changes as teachers and students continue to explore and implement with new way of learning. Our current 2015-2016 registrations for the main school are at 294 students with 12 divisions.
